



China Programme at Asia House

Asia House has set itself the task of furthering the exchange of information between Asia-related organisations in Europe and in Asia and the Pacific.

More specifically the German Asia Foundation focuses on civil society initiatives in China and on European-Chinese relations.

The China Programme is a project of the German Asia Foundation.

Why China?

China is a country that abounds in contradictions and has many facets. China's development triggers admiration, but also anxiety. The violation of human rights and environmental pollution dominate public discussion

The future of our planet will depend on how the relations between Europe and China are carved out. And these issues are too important to be left solely in the hands of politicians and tycoons. Civil society needs to be involved.

Humane, socially just and environmentally sound

With our work on China, we aim to bring over knowledge that is based on facts relating to China and to relations between Europe and China, at the same time encouraging cooperation and exchange with Chinese organisations.

The China programme draws on its cooperation with a variety of European and Chinese organisations that address the subjects of social and ecological justice and the protection of human rights.
